Door contest ready for the open house until parent-teacher night. October 11 Toolbox workshop Working on new ways to make money - rental of the building. 30% of the rental money goes to the school. Over the summer approx \$4000 - over the year another school is renting on the weekend. Additional income.

Sept 14 Fire drill - evacuation in less than 3 minutes - next to silent. Excellent results Attestation day - only about 15-20 students absent

Open House October 18 - student council doing tours (1:30-3 and again 6-7)
